**Re: Security Council Renews Arms Embargo, Travel Ban, Asset Freeze Imposed on
Those Threatening Peace in Yemen**

Dear Registrant,

The Compliance Commission wishes to inform that the Security Council adopted a resolution extending for one year the arms embargo on Yemen, as well as the travel ban and asset freeze against those threatening peace in that country. By the terms of resolution 2624 (2022) (to be issued as document S/RES/2624(2022)), adopted, the 15-member Council extended, until 28 February 2023, the measures first imposed by its resolution 2140 (2014), relating to the travel ban and asset freeze, as well as the provisions in resolution 2216 (2015) relating to the targeted arms embargo, while noting that those are not intended to have adverse humanitarian consequences for Yemeni civilians.
